DR. RICHARD KONTEH'S PERSPECTIVES ON THE FUTURE OF APC PARTY

DEAR FRIENDS ACROSS THE POLITICAL DIVIDE



Sierra Leone is a nation of rules. believe it or not. Rules define Sierra Leonean politics and government. Our democracy is an empty abstraction: It does not really exist. Instead, we have rules and procedures for choosing those who govern us and for holding them accountable. The rules are not immutable; they evolve slowly and with care. This feels boring and uninspiring. Yes, it was designed to be that way, and it is precisely what makes our country functional. If you want excitement, you will get a dictator—one who will give us political overstimulation and decades of tyranny.

Yes, we are a nation of rules, and the rules are boring. Embrace that. In times of difficulty, go with the boring option. When faced with a frightening crisis, tamp it down with ultra-boring moves. No matter what, let us stick with the rules.

We can not avoid talking about the outcome of the 2023 elections, but we will mention it briefly here. Most Sierra Leoneans don't like how it unravelled.

This is about you, you the dieheart, faithful APC or SLPP supporter. When you demonize those who disagree with you, you invite treatment in kind. When you refuse to engage in political argument and resort to performative moralizing, you make it clear to any neutral observer that for you, there is only one side, one opinion, one conformist crowd that can ever govern legitimately. The rest are disgusting subhumans who should never be tolerated near the levers of power. When you trample on the rules that say "all are created equal" like that, you are destroying the fabric that holds the country together. And believe it or not, you will reap the whirlwind.

Free speech is a rule among us. It is closely bound to the search for truth. When you justify state censorship, you pitch your camp in the kingdom of lies. And believe it: The chaos you impose from above will erupt with a million times the force and consume you from below.

Sierra Leonean laws and rules exist to maintain order. These laws and regulations are not for settling our political disputes. That is the rule. When you criminalize dissent and equate nonconformity with progress haters, tribalism, or terrorism, you have lost the thread of how this country works. When you threaten to lock up opponents so they can be converted into loyal followers, you channel the regime of dictatorship. When you viciously try to eliminate members of the opposition, you practice the same style of mafia politics as all dictators do. When you stop opponents from freely campaigning or you ban a candidate's name from the ballot to preserve "our democracy," you sound, frankly, like you have gone nuts. And believe it or not, it will come back to haunt you.

We may disagree, but please don't dismiss the other person as a moral abomination. Don't curse them or swear them. Don't prosecute them for their political views. Let them be!

Disagreement is information—it is a favour you do to the other

person by calling out the potential gaps and the mistakes in their opinions. When we are in the excitement of the moment, especially during election times. it feels like an enormous gulf separates us. But that is only true if you want it to be: Distance is always a matter of perspective. And you know perfectly well that in your family and among your friends, there are individuals who disagree with you politically—people just like you, except for this one little thing called politics.

When we have elections, the two big parties nominate their candidates. A few outsiders may find their way into the ballot. We, the people (Sierra Leoneans), as we have always done since independence, we choose among these candidates. The results should be counted center by center and sent to the Electoral Commission (ECSL). ECSL should collate and report those results accurately. Those are the rules. If you mess with them, there will be chaos. If your side wins, be boring about itno censorship, demonization, or show trials. People will love you for it. If your side loses, look in the mirror and ask yourself why. Any other thing is an insult to "we the people," for whom you must retain some vestige of affection and respect.

Whatever the outcome of an election, we will have to live together. Anything else will be self-destructive. Be boring instead. Look for common ground in politics. If there is none, then look to our common humanity. Our differences of opinion may seem profound, but all of us want what is best for our families, the neighbourhoods we live in and the country we love. We can raise our voices in anger, but there should be no malice in this debate—win or lose.

The Unifier Magazine is only a voice crying out from inside a noisy media ghetto, but we hope that you can hear what we are saying and that we can find a way to talk. We wish we could push aside the worst among us and bring the best forward to be the living heart of this crazy, pluralistic society. We wish we could open your eyes and let you see yourself the way people see you. For all our sakes, we wish we could persuade you that the rules are the rules and to break them is suicide. And do not take it the wrong way, friends, but please help so that all of us enjoy this one country we call Sierra Leone. Let us live in unity! Because, We All Nar Wan!



Issue No. 1: Extremely higher voter turnout in SLPP stronghold than APC

Statistics:

Voter turnout in SLPP stronghold in the Southeast is at an average of 90%, while in APC stronghold in the Northwest voter turnout is less than 80%.

Comment:

This is unprecedented and unattested in previous elections (from 2007 to 2018), where average voter turnout is between 75 and 80%. Why the massive increase in turnout in only SLPP stronghold without a corresponding increase in other areas of the country? This is questionable.

Political divisions, often exacerbated during electoral cycles, have led to polarization and a focus on partisan interests over national welfare. Such divisions impede formulating and implementing policies that could address the needs of all citizens, reinforcing a cycle of discontent and division, regionally and ethnically.

Recently, the relationship between President Julius Maada Bio and former President Ernest Bai Koroma has shown to be complex and fraught with tension, marked by political rivalry and accusations. I hope you know the details how we got this point by now. If not, please go back to our January publication and read the article "2023: Reflecting on the Year That Was."

The tense relationship between President Bio and former President Koroma casts a shadow over Sierra Leone's political landscape, raising national unity and reconciliation concerns.




